From the Keyboard of... District Superintendent Dave Byrum

Dear Wesley family and friends,

I first want to thank you for the very gracious reception you have given to me since I have come to walk with you through this Transition time between pastors. Thanks to the willing participation of so many, I learned a lot from our Congregational meeting last Sunday, and look forward to a bright future for Wesley UMC. Following is some information for the near-term:

First, with your Staff-Parish Committee I have made arrangements for the Rev. Eric Swenson, Pastor of Evangelical UMC in Ohio to provide pastoral care for you during the Transition. Eric is a fine young pastor who is in the Ordination Process in the West Ohio Annual Conference. He is already licensed to perform ministerial duties in the UMC. Eric will be on-call for pastoral emergencies; he will visit in the hospital and nursing homes; he will visit shut-ins in their homes; and he will conduct funerals and weddings. After the first of the year he is also open to teaching a Bible Study. **Eric's contact information is here: Church phone: 937.968.4301, Home phone: 937.968.3137.** If you have a pastoral emergency you may call him directly or call Gina Spence who will be able to relay your message and need.

Second, following is the worship schedule for Advent and Christmas:

Dec. 1, First Sunday of Advent: Worship Theme: "Hope". Pastor Curtis Banker, Associate Pastor at Richmond Central UMC will be preaching.

Then, for the next three Sundays plus Christmas Eve I'll lead us through a series of weekly reflections on how God interrupts, surprises, and invites us to live in a new way we never expected.

Dec. 8, Advent II, *God intrudes on our Despair* The promise of Christmas is that your life isn't fixed into a pre-determined rut; things can change for the better.

Dec. 15, Advent III, *God Intrudes on our "Way"* God's intrusion always calls for a lifechange of some kind.

Dec. 22, Advent IV, God Intrudes on our Plans God's intrusion always seems to mess up our life for the hetter!

7:00 pm – Plans are in formation, to be announced


11:00pm - Lessons and Carols with candle lighting.


